Minutes of an Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council held
At the Village Hall, Pebworth on Monday 4th October 2021

108	Apologies accepted for absence: Cllr Meynell
109	Disclosures of Interests: Members were reminded of the need to keep their register of interests updated. Members were asked to declare any Disclosable Pecuniary or other Interests in items considered in virtual meetings and their nature. None declared
110	Open Forum: The Chairman suspended the formal meeting for the Ward Members and public participation. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The path along Chapel Rd is beginning to crack. Cllr Pearson to send photos to Clerk who will inform Highways. • Two residents gave their views on the planning application on Cider Mill Barns and questioned how the Parish Council would respond to the appeal. This to be discussed under agenda items 114 (a) and (f). • An update was requested on the VAS – no further update from Honeybourne Parish Council. Cllr Weller stated that the council will be reviewing the opportunity to purchase a VAS device as part of the budget setting process for the next financial period. • Drainage culvert by the fire station is blocked. Clerk to report to Highways – it was initially thought this was a job for the Lengthsman hence the delay. • Reports were made regarding potholes from Little Meadows to the crossroads. Clerk to report to Highways. • Representatives of Pebworth in Bloom attended: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The railings have now been painted by 14 volunteers. An invoice was handed to Clerk for payment. - A request was made to contact Rooftop Housing requesting they remove the dead hedge backing on to The Close and replace with a fence. Clerk to email once address has been confirmed. - They advised that Gold was awarded by Heart of England in Bloom; total points 93/100. Members congratulated PIB on their hard work. - They discussed their vision of a tree canopy for the Platinum Jubilee. Members requested they put forward a plan detailing the types of trees, how big they will grow, the size of the canopy etc. They will also need to consider the protected view in the NDP and the overhead cables. • The posts on Front St will be repaired now the ground is softer. <p>County Councillor Adams talked through his report which is appended to the minutes. District Councillor Havemann-Mart was not in attendance.</p> <p>The Chairman closed the open forum and reconvened the meeting at 20:20</p>
111	Matters raised in Ward Members' reports Cllr Weller asked what the Parish Council can do regarding traffic calming other than considering painted roundels and a VAS. County Councillor Adams advised that the only thing that works is enforcement stating that most speeding vehicles are local drivers. There is pressure to provide more enforcement vans. A local police officer has been carrying out speed checks in the last month.

It was resolved for future complaints to provide evidence and a statement.</p> <p>c) Members noted the proposed draft Local Listed Building Supplementary Planning Document, with no response.</p> <p>d) As the deadline to apply for the Public Arts Money of £171.29 has now expired Members decided not to proceed with the village information board, but to consider it in the future should any further monies become available.</p>

To see roadworks in the area over the next month, please visit <https://one.network/> to see all the details.

1. **Pavement along Broad Marston Rd from the Mason Arms to the Old Fire Station** – I am keeping pressure on Highways to resurface this stretch of pavement but if you can add your voice to the campaign, please report on defects on <https://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/Report> . Click on the “Other Road or Pavement Issues” and add photos if you can.
2. **Back Lane - Road Closure - 20th October** ; Laying ducting for fibre for Broadband
3. **Drain survey to be done of the Gullies in Broad Marston** to see if any need non-return valves fitted.
4. **Blue Lias stone steps to be re-installed off the pavement in Front St.** The blue Lias stone was kindly donated by Clive & Caro Warren during the re-surfacing of the pavement last year.

The SAD FACT is people are still putting the wrong things into their green bins. Things that cannot be recycled by EnviroSort.. All the rubbish from the green bins goes on conveyor belts, and there are about 30 people that have to sort out the wrong items which are rejected into a skip which then goes into landfill. About 10-13% of items are rejected.

Update on flooding alleviation/wetlands nature reserve in Broad Marston

The EXCELLENT NEWS is the Environment Agency have at last issued a permit for the works to begin. As mentioned in last month’s report, a local Broad Marston resident has offered to do the works at cost, and another Broad Marston home owner has offered to pay for the works too.

Work to begin on 6th October, and after 10 years of fighting for a flood plain upstream of Broad Marston, we are nearly there!

Not only will this scheme hold water back from entering Broad Marston in flood situations, it will also be an all year round wetlands nature reserve with fantastic wild-life and wild flowers. I look forward to cutting the ribbon once it is built.

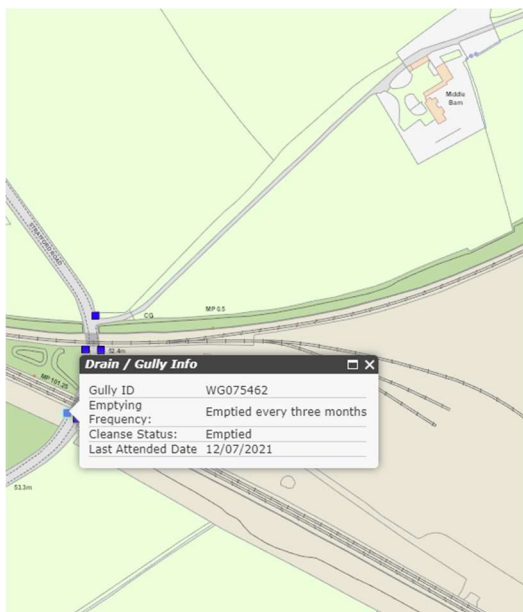

NEW Worcestershire Road Gullys Interactive Map

There are over 104,000 road gullys in Worcestershire and keeping them all cleansed and working is a major headache! The council is just trialling a new road gullys map which will be launched to the public by Christmas. Residents will be able to report blocked gullys, see when a gully was last emptied and see if a problem with a gully has been identified and remedy work been programmed.

The other good news is with this new mapping system, which will be available on line, the frequency of cleansing certain problematic gullys has been reviewed. For example the gullys under Honeybourne railway bridges on Stratford Rd will now be emptied every 3 months which hopefully will help reduce the flooding under these bridges; see below
