Subject: Re: 40/ 50 mph limit

Dear Donna, Proposed words to WCC Highways:

During a Quinton Parish road assessment by Warwickshire County Council Highways, they observed that the change of speed limit southbound on the B4632 Campden Road between the roundabout into Meon Vale and the then new roundabout which created easier access to and from Meon Way Gardens in Worcestershire from a speed limit of 40 mph to 50 mph between the two roundabouts and within a few hundred yards of the Tailor's Lane / Meon Way Gardens roundabout was "strange".

In the subsequent road assessment sent to Quinton PC a cost was given by WCC to rationalise this to one 40 mph speed limit until beyond the Tailor's Lane roundabout. Quinton Parish Council did not pursue this as it does not consider this to be a Parish matter to finance but a County Highways issue which stemmed during the creation of the new roundabout and should be corrected by WCC.

The 50 mph speed limit has since been questioned by Pebworth Parish Council as a concern by its residents in Meon Way Gardens, particularly their school children, heading north beside the Campden Road and whilst those persons originate outside the Parish, District, County they are in Quinton Parish for that journey and both Parishes believe that Warwickshire County Council should rectify this anomaly.

WCC Report said:

OPTION 5 – Extending the existing 40mph Speed Limit on Campden Road over the new roundabout and beyond Tailors Lane in a southerly direction for approximately 300m as the existing roundabout currently sits within a 50mph speed limit (Approximate cost £6,000).



40mph speed limit extension proposal South beyond the new roundabout as shown.
